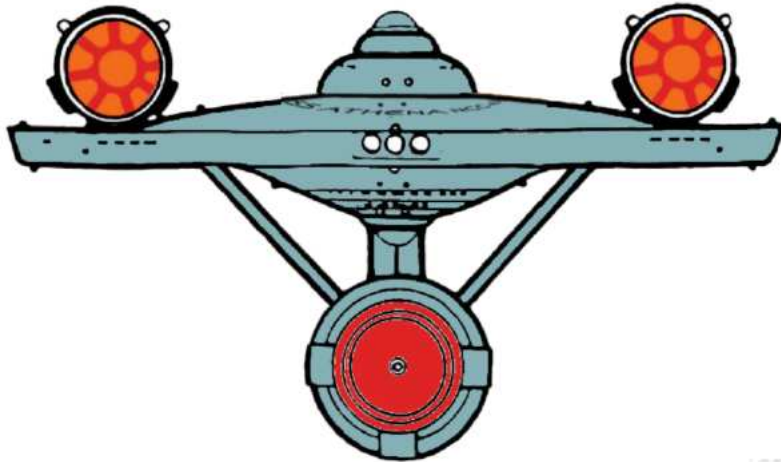

## Brief



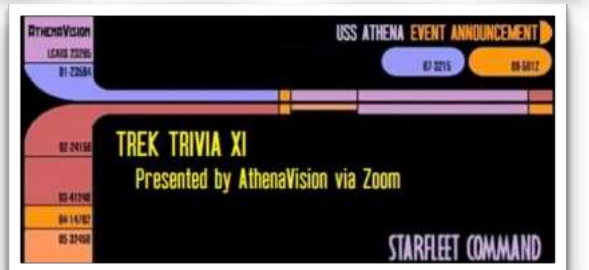

## STAR TREK THE NEXT GENERATION

### Q-IN-LAW

A Novel By Peter David

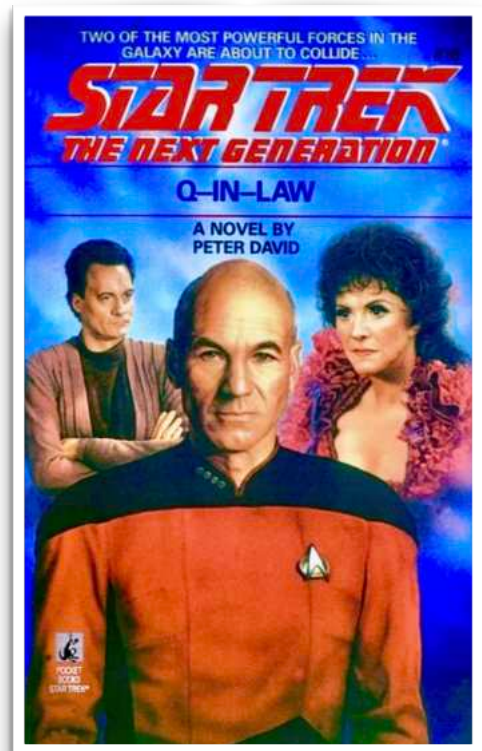
As we lost the author Peter David earlier this year, I was thinking a lot about my favorite Star Trek book ever, which he wrote. I finally made it to his table at Dragon Con a few years ago, with my tattered and well read paperback for him to sign. As I expected, he was quite happy to see such a beat up copy. Authors so often are, because it shows them you truly loved the work, and carried it with you, and re-read it many times.

Such is the case with Q-In-Law. I first read this back in high school, when ST:TNG was still on TV. If you come across it, the cover just grabs you. Back then, when such covers were painted artwork, the artist really grabbed the premise of the book and made it speak out to you in the expressions on the faces. The Premise? Lwaxana Troi is on board the Enterprise when Q pays a visit. Let the games begin. I was Sold. And honestly, I don't want to say much more so as not to spoil anything. All you need to know is that these two massive egos meet and inevitably clash, with Picard and the crew caught in the middle.

Beyond that, do yourself a favor and find out for yourself. Peter David is an excellent Trek author, whether TOS or TNG, he had a great grasp of the characters' best natures, and could write them both seriously and comedically. The interplay would have made for a fantastic episode, and in fact he told me that both John de Lancie and Majel Barrett wanted to and begged the studio, but were denied for unknown reasons. Given that the studio did accept unsolicited scripts, hopefully it was just a budget

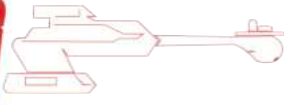
issue and not that a primarily comic book author had delivered a better story than anything in the first 2 seasons. What's g r e a t is that it is entertaining, lighthearted, and a fun ride with everyone you already love or love to hate. It's not dulled down by too much technobabble, or too serious a lesson to be learned. It does carry a bit of life lessons if you want them, but nothing heavy-handed. A great book for a quick light read, at which point, the expressions on the artwork will have new meaning.

A final note from Mr. David. I have yet to listen to it, but he did say if you can find the audiobook, it was read by both John de Lancie, and Majel Barrett, adding their fun and talent to the read.



# COSTUMING JOURNEYS

Winter 2025

Thrifting and second hand shopping can be a money saver. Sometimes you can come across a unique piece of clothing that can inspire you to create a costume. Look at items with an imaginative eye as to what it could be with a few modifications.

In this article, I will discuss the process of gathering and making a Female Klingon costume look in general. It is not a specific character, but has the feel of Klingons from Star Trek Films, The Next Generation Era, and DS9 Klingon Noblewoman Sirella (the Lady of the House of Martok), along with other female Klingon characters, such as Grilka, Ch'Rega, and K'Ehleyr (the half-human, half-Klingon).

Now, the inspiration piece is a plus sized black dress with faux leather scales on one sleeve, neck, and on part of the dress shoulder. It was "saying warrior". The garment fit loosely on our model, so with a few modifications this dress will work. The dress being of polyester mesh and knit fabric could be cut with no fear of raveling. The dress was cut off to convert to tunic length and the sleeves were also cut to fall at the wrist. (**Tip** keep all bits and pieces of fabric you cut off any garment until that costume is finished. You might need or find another use for them while constructing the outfit.) The neck of dress was a bit big as well, so the addition of a hook and eye closure at the back can help hold loose parts together. Now the dress is a warrior's tunic to be worn with black leggings that can also be thrifted or found in your personal wardrobe. "Biker" leather gloves and faux leather "biker style" boots were purchased through a popular selling app for very low prices. These items can also be thrifted or found second hand. It is all how you look at items; can you visualize them as something different? (**Tip** Be on the lookout for other thrifted items such as belts, headbands, scarves, and jewelry items that can be used with your costume as accessories, dismantled for construction or decorative parts, etc. )

A thrifted belt with silver toggle style buckle adds to this warrior look. A belt pouch is added, made from the inside pocket of a faux leather pewter purse/tote. The attached strap was cut and folded down, fastened with office supply two prong brads. The resulting loops of strap hold pouch onto belt.

## Blood Cancer United Light The Night

I met with fellow Athena members, Kathy and Ryan, and we walked the short distance to the park. When we first got to the park, we went through a security check and then signed in. While there, we picked up our lanterns. The lanterns are symbolic: The red is for supporters, the yellow is in honor or in memory of, and the white lanterns are for survivors. We listened to the dedications and announcements and learned the history of Blood Cancer United and stories of how cancer had affected some of the speakers and their families.

After the welcome announcements, there was an order to dim the field lights. After that, we were instructed to turn the lanterns on and to raise them in order. The survivors were told to move to the center of the grouping and hold up their white lanterns. It's always a very moving part of the ceremony.

And until you see how many lives cancer has touched, you can't comprehend what it's like. The lantern ceremony demonstrates a very small part of people affected.

After the lantern ceremony, we walked around the track until it was time to take our seats for the fireworks. It's always a special treat and a great way to end the night.

There are many types of cancer, and there are many types of blood cancer. Leukemia is very personal for Kathy, being the illness that took her brother Billy much too young. It was in his honor we walked.

That made me realize how lucky I am to have survived cancer.

In 1984, I was almost 10 years old when I was diagnosed with Leukemia. We had a great family doctor who recognized some of my symptoms and steered my mother to contact Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville. There, I was officially diagnosed with Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia. I spent almost two weeks in the hospital, being tested and prepped for what was to be the next 2+ years of my life.

I ended up having surgery to insert a Broviac catheter that went into my chest to deliver the chemotherapy medication as efficiently as

possible, since my illness and young age caused my veins to be uncooperative. Luckily I didn't need to have radiation, but I went through two years of IV and oral chemotherapy. I was told I'd be sickly and have frequent hospital stays. The docs also said my growth may even be stunted. I grew up to be 5'9" so I think I'm okay with being stunted.

Technically, I've been in remission for 40 years. I was diagnosed early and given a 95-98% chance of a complete recovery.

Cancer research is still a very important part of working to eliminate all cancer, so no one has to experience it or witness the effects on a friend or loved one.

Blood Cancer United is and has been the leading organization for everyone affected by blood cancer since 1949.

The total amount raised was \$918,442.00 with \$470 being donated by Team Billy.

In memory of those who have passed. In honor of the fighters, the survivors and their families. And in awe of medical personnel, researchers, businesses and those individuals who help in any way to try to put an end to cancer.

Here's to 40 more years cancer-free for me, with the goal to completely eradicate all types of cancer in the (hopefully) near future.

Feisty feta dip, pita, pastitsio, baked chicken, and gyros were some of the delectables that we enjoyed at the Grecian Family Restaurant. Marie was the first one to pipe up and say that she wanted to start out with spanakopita, a savory pastry that is made with delicate, paper-thin sheets of phyllo dough, feta cheese, and spinach that is baked to a golden, crunchy perfection. The appetizer platter included this and more.

Restaurant owner Frank Georgalos came out and mingled with members towards the end of our meal.



This restaurant is not only known for its authentic Greek dishes, but also for the incredible variety of homemade desserts. Baklava and Athenian chocolate mousse were instant favorites!

What are some of the Hellenic cultural notes that intersect with Star Trek? On the original series episode "Who Mourns for Adonais?", the *Enterprise* is captured by an alien claiming to be the Greek god of the sun, Apollo. He claims

that he and others (Zeus, Athena, Aphrodite, Hermes, Hera, and Artemis) were a "gallant band of travelers" who visited Earth some five thousand years ago. Apollo intended to make Carolyn Palamas his queen and the



mother of a new race of godlike beings.

Also, actress Marina Sirtis claims Greek ancestry since her parents were from the island of Cyprus. In 2024 she was presented with a Saturn Lifetime Achievement Award for her role on *Star Trek: The Next Generation*.



In fact, the USS Athena was named in tribute to the goddess Athena, whose statue is inside the Parthenon in Nashville's Centennial Park. It is a full-scale replica of the original structure found in Athens, Greece.



# DECK 8 FOOD AND BEVERAGE PREPARATION FACILITIES

## CAPTAIN PIKE'S BBQ BABY BACK RIBS!

We all know that Captain Pike loves to cook for the crew of the U.S.S. Enterprise! Here is my take on what I'm sure would be one of the crew's favorites.

First, start off with a rack of ribs and turn them over bone-side



up. With your finger or the handle of a spoon, find where the membrane separates from the meat and get a good grip of the membrane to take it off. This will help the ribs become more tender.

Next take your choice of mustard, Worcestershire sauce, or hot sauce, and rub both sides of the ribs with it. This is called a binder and it helps your seasoning stick to the ribs. Next, season the ribs with any BBQ rub you like or make it yourself. A very simple and good one is this. The amounts of each spice is up to you.

- Salt
- Pepper
- Onion powder
- Garlic powder
- Ground mustard
- Cayenne pepper (for optional heat)
- Brown sugar

Season the ribs heavily. If you have a smoker heat it up to 225F. If you use an oven, use the

same temp. If using an oven I highly recommend that you use a roasting pan with a lid. Add a small amount of liquid (any will work), and place ribs in with the lid on. Bake for 6 hours or until your desired tenderness.

For a smoker, place ribs in and smoke for 3 hours or until they are 165F. Next wrap your ribs in aluminum foil. One optional step is when you wrap your ribs, add butter, honey, and some more BBQ rub. Wrap ribs tightly and place back in smoker, meat side down for 2 hours. Take ribs out and open them up, place BBQ sauce on the meat side and put back in the smoker for 1 hour or until desired tenderness. Use your favorite BBQ sauce or make it yourself.

### BBQ sauce homemade

- 1/2 a white or yellow onion, blended
- 3 to 5 garlic cloves
- 1 jalapeño (optional)

Add some Worcestershire and hot sauce

To a medium sized-pot, add a small amount of veg oil or canola oil (do not use olive oil).

Cook mixture till almost dry, then add 2 Oz of tomato paste. Cook until fragrant. Add about 2 cups ketchup, a cup of brown sugar, hot sauce, Worcestershire sauce and your BBQ rub to taste.

Cook for about 20 min or to the desired thickness you like.

This is just my recipe. Feel free to add, take out, or change anything about it that fits your taste and most importantly ENJOY!



# STARFLEET MEDICAL

## A Counselor's Responsibility On A Starship

What do you really know about the responsibility and role that counselors have aboard starships or space stations? Most of us are familiar with Deanna Troi,

Enterprise's primary counselor (*ST: TNG*). Her

Betazoid half allowed her to sense the emotions of others, making her more sensitive to matters that may

impact operations and crew morale. There are also other, less famous

counselors aboard ships who provided consultation,

therapy, and opinions that also deserve an honorable mention. These include, but are not limited to, Dr. Gabers Migleemo of the *USS Cerritos (ST: Lower Decks)* and Dr. Hugh Culber (*ST: DSC*), serving as a Physician and Counselor. Although there are other crew members on ships identified as counselors, their backgrounds are not always in the medical or mental health field. Many of these individuals appear better suited to provide advice to officers and peers on everyday matters or defense and combat strategies.

Regardless of Star Trek's future world being full of wonder, exciting technology, and exploration, dealing with emotions, understanding others, and helping people cope with trauma, depression, anxiety, stress, and other mental health issues are still things that must be dealt with for the welfare of the



individual and the crew. (Hey, McCoy couldn't fix everything with a pill or hypospray.)

What are the primary responsibilities of a ship's counselor? These include:

- Provide mental health support
- Provide trauma/stress management
- Act as advisor to the captain or commanding officer
- Perform personnel evaluations and duty assessments
- Promote the overall wellbeing of the crew

Ensuring the mental health and well-being of Federation personnel

is critical to the success of a mission or the survival of a crew. Historically, counselors were utilized

to provide the responsibilities mentioned above beginning in the 24th century across the board. A skilled, well-trained counselor could make a significant difference for someone unable to function in their position or life, or help someone identify and address their issues to achieve success. In cases where an individual is unable to perform their duties, a counselor can also remove them from duty, just like the Chief Medical Officer, if they believe the individual is unable to perform their duties effectively.

Crew members serving on outposts, starbases, and ships constantly had to



deal with death/loss, anxiety, trauma, depression, and other chronic mental health disorders. For example, Lt. Barclay's (*ST: TNG*) issues with self-confidence, fear of transporters, and his neurotic behaviors were addressed with the help of Deanna Troi, who assisted him in overcoming some of these issues.

Another example is Captain Jean-Luc Picard, who experienced PTSD from his assimilation by the Borg, experiencing trauma and guilt for his actions he could not control. His discussions with Deanna Troi and Guinan helped him

deal with what happened.

However, there are those even in the Star Trek world who are unwilling to seek out a counselor. For example, Miles O'Brien (*ST: TNG* & *ST: DS9*) preferred to seek counsel from his friends rather than a counselor. This probably holds true no matter what century. Being in the mental health field, the success of therapy is dependent on the commitment and motivation of the client to address their issues.

One's environmental exposure further plays a vital role in exacerbating mental health symptoms and increasing the risk of suicide or erratic behavior. Think of living in a space, separated by millions and millions of miles

from your home, dependent on the crew and shelter of a spacecraft or station to provide you with basic needs (oxygen, food, clothing). Loss of life support, temporal anomalies, conspiracies within Starfleet, holodeck malfunctions resulting in a horrible experience, and so much more are just examples of things that could lead to the breakdown of a crew member. Then there is the tremendous amount of stress associated with making contact with other lifeforms who may be aggressive or act in a way that could result in you being harmed. (I'm sure somewhere there is a disorder known as "Red Shirt/Uniform Syndrome" due to the likelihood that someone in engineering or security wearing a red shirt will be more likely to die.) If you were in a command position, you would face the stress of being responsible for hundreds or more people living, dying, or being injured, depending on the decisions you made.

Back here in the 21st century, having been in the mental health field for over 30 years, primarily working with neglected and abused children placed in out-of-home care (residential and therapeutic foster care), the one thing you learn no matter what your area of focus is "therapy can be beneficial for those that seek it and want it." Even though there is a stigma still attached to having a mental health issue and asking for treatment, it has progressively gotten better as more resources have been put in place, and there are more proactive programs to reach out to others, starting before children reach grade school.

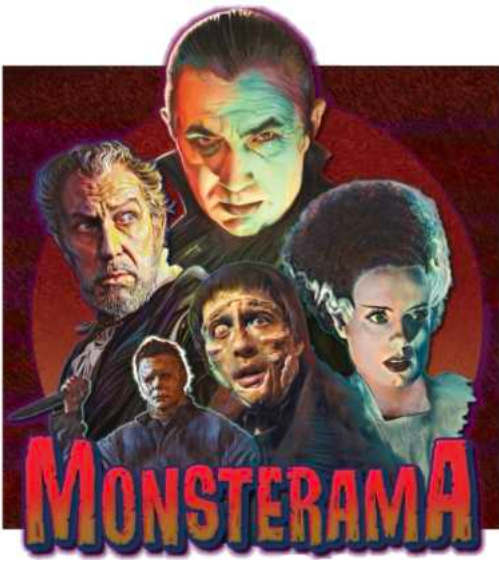

# I'm not crying, you're crying

Thoughts on Episode 2, Season 4, TNG, *Family*

My childhood was peppered with Next Generation episodes and reruns. I remember sinking deeper into my bean bag chair (still cool) at nearly any point in the day to enjoy the comfort of careening through interstellar space, meeting new, almost always humanoid, species in strange worlds, and accepting the fact that not all planets are habitable... but it makes for a MUCH easier writing process.

Tense moments for sure, but that anxiety of a cliffhanger, or seeing the crew in some improbable mess in which the prime directive and personal feelings are at odds with each other never truly affected my viewership. The reason? Jean-Luc at the helm.

Picard is a titan: stoic, intelligent, emotionally regulated, and purely fueled by recurrent cups of Earl Grey. When I think of a captain, I think of Picard. He is neither rash nor petty. All that he does is calculated, and regardless of the situation or circumstance, his demeanor remains the same. This is his greatest asset. He wields with a cool, calm, and collected mind sharpened by years of experience and a treasure trove of Shakespearian references.



*Family* is a pinnacle moment in Picard's character development and an absolute showcase of Patrick

Stewart's indelible grip on the human condition through his acting prowess.

**Spoilers ahead...** though, not sure a warning is necessary with this audience.

*Family* is an episode highlighting the aftermath of this crew's first experience with the Borg (truly the most terrifying villain I have ever read about or watched). *Family* is the simple name. The content, much more complex.

The main story follows Picard as he decides to visit his brother Robert at their family vineyard. We learn very quickly that the relationship between the two brothers is steeped in historical strain mostly stemming from Jean-Luc's decision to join Starfleet and move away from the family business.

This theme plays throughout the episode, somewhat mirrored in a visit from Worf's parents, and Beverly's discovery of Jack Crusher's personal items. Survivor's guilt is



blatantly visible throughout each moment of the episode. My focus though, is Picard. Jean-Luc and Robert trade shot for shot throughout the vineyard scenes on all issues, exacerbated by pieces of dialogue such as Marie (Robert's wife) informing Picard that the mayor wanted to have a parade in his favor, or Robert's criticism of Jean-Luc's degrading palate due to years of synthehol. An even bigger strain; Rene (Picard's "uncle") clearly admires Jean-Luc and his well-known achievements. Robert is well aware of the adoration and does not want his son to follow in

Jean-Luc's footsteps. Despite Robert's efforts, Rene remains undeterred in viewing Jean-Luc as a never-ending source of aspiration.

An old friend of Jean-Luc's pays a visit to the vineyard with the intentions of offering Jean-Luc a director position for the New Atlantis Project, an effort to create a subcontinent on the mid-Atlantic Ridge. The offer symbolized, but also quite literally, a return to Earth and a chance to revert the decision he made long ago to leave his family on Earth. It was a chance to set things straight with his family, to resolve all that remained bitter, hurt, and left behind. The crew however, had inadvertently become his second family through sheer time spent together, tragedies they'd endured, and triumphs to look forward to. And so, in the midst of survivor's guilt, he is faced with yet another gut-wrenching decision fueled by even more guilt. He considers it... but the show must go on. So, for a second time, Picard chooses the Enterprise.

Bickering spattered throughout the episode but the crescendo begins as Jean-Luc walks out on Robert, who continues to pester Jean-Luc with reminders of his past and jealousy-induced comments. The argument continues into the fields as Robert tries to break down Jean-Luc's resolve. It works. Robert receives a punch in the face, courtesy of that balding, tea drinking, thespian that I admire so much.

After some good ol' brother to brother rough housing, they laugh nervously. The laughter from Picard becomes desperate, seamlessly transitioning to a racking, uncontrollable sob in which he fully comes to term with all that pains him.

**Captain Jean-Luc Picard:** *You don't know, Robert. You don't know... They took everything I was. They used me to kill and to destroy and I couldn't stop them.*



**Captain Jean-Luc Picard:** *I should have been able to stop them. I tried... I tried so hard. But I wasn't strong enough! I wasn't good enough! I should have been able to stop them, I should've, I should...!*

**Robert Picard:** *So - my brother is a human being after all. This is going to be with you a long time, Jean-Luc. A long time. You have to learn to live with it. You have a simple choice now: live with it below the sea with Louis - or above the clouds with the Enterprise. [they help each other up from the ground]*

**Captain Jean-Luc Picard:** *You know, I think you were right, after all. I think I did come back so that you could help me.*



**Robert Picard:** *Yeah... Do you know what? I still don't like you, Jean-Luc.*

The denouement. A rare, unraveling of Jean-Luc's complicated emotions haunted by the past and a

humanizing moment that simultaneously proved to the viewers and to Robert that Jean-Luc is subject to the same trials and tribulations of the human condition that we all face. His stoicism and calm demeanor even more impressive after witnessing the range of emotions, a spectrum he kept stowed away for the majority of the series to that point. The weight of the crew, the burden of survivor's guilt, his past decisions that continue to plague him... Jean-Luc impresses and commands to the utmost efficiency despite all of it. He hides it all to retain the fortified front that we all know and love. The Enterprise, his *raison d'être*. Perhaps though, it is necessary to see this side of him.

This episode remains a favorite of mine to this day. Jean-Luc is an enigma, his depths rarely explored. Here, we're offered a sobering glimpse.

I shall end with this fitting line from *Measure of a Man*: "It is possible to commit no mistakes and still lose." That is not a weakness. That is life."

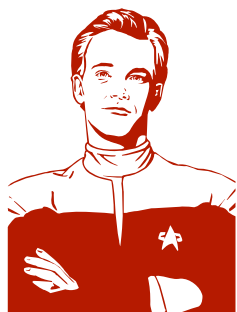


